We are happy to announce the appointment of Rev. Beth Harbaugh as pastor to St. Paul's United Methodist Church in Williamsburg, Iowa beginning July 1, 2024.

Beth began her ministry like most laity, serving UM churches where she lived after having been raised in Waverly and baptized as a baby at Trinity UMC. She went to Trinity until she was confirmed, but she remembers asking the pastor's wife a question in the white collar church when she was about 6-7 that was very theological. Ask her to tell you about it.

She began her candidacy for ministry in 1994. While still working full time managing a large sport shoe dept. at Cedar Falls Scheels, she earned her Bachelor of Arts in World Religions with minors in Anthropology and Ethics at UNI.

She often tells people that work in shoe stores to be careful, because if you sit at people's feet for 10 years, it turns you into a pastor...

She then earned her Master of Divinity degree at University of Dubuque Theological Seminary while serving as half-time Associate Pastor for Heritage UMC in Waverly. After graduation in 2001 she received her probationary membership and her first full time two-point appointment at Mount Hope UMC (the church in the movie 'COUNTRY' about the farm crisis) near Waterloo and Dunkerton UM church. In 2004, she was ordained. She then completed her Doctor of Ministry degree right before she was appointed to St. James UMC in Cedar Rapids. After almost a year, the church and city were flooded and her D-Min project with it. She focused on flood recovery and rebuilding for the remaining 5 years of her ministry there. She has also served at Union Church in Lake City, Fairfield UMC, Women at the Well, and is currently serving Christ through Van Meter UMC until June 30th.

Beth has 5 daughters who, with their families, have shared a meaningful family life, along with the church family life in the churches that she has served. Her beloved husband, Blair, died while they were in Lake City in 2014. She was very grateful that Rev. Harlan Gillespie was able to come to Lake City to officiate at his funeral, because Blair considered him his pastor.

Beth's life and ministry have been very diverse with changes in each church that she has served. She has also just taken the position of Co-Chair for the Iowa Conference Board of Discipleship.

Rev. Beth is very grateful as she looks forward to serving St. Paul's UMC and is already listening for where the Holy Spirit might lead us to respond together. She feels that she is simply a Christian who has stepped out into the mystery of faith and taken the time and energy required to be set aside for ministry of Christ in the grateful spirit of joy. She quotes Frederick Buechner, "Your vocation in life is where your greatest joy meets [one of] the world's greatest needs."


